Spread the Word: Two \$1,500 Scholarship Opportunities Open for Arizona High School Seniors

Archer Ragsdale Arizona Chapter (ARAC), Tuskegee Airmen, Inc. encourages community to share deadlines and eligibility details

PHOENIX, AZ — March 4, 2026 — Arizona high school seniors planning to attend college this fall may be eligible for two scholarship opportunities offering **\$1,500 awards** through the **Archer Ragsdale Arizona Chapter (ARAC), Tuskegee Airmen, Inc.** Scholarship Coordinator **Diana Gregory** is urging parents, educators, coaches, mentors, and community members to share the opportunities quickly, as deadlines are approaching. “These scholarships can make a real difference for students who are working hard and need support to take the next step,” Gregory said. “A quick share with a student who qualifies could help them access funding—and in one case, potentially unlock many more opportunities.”

Ashby-Herring Scholarships — \$1,500 (Deadline: April 6)

Eligible students apply through the **Arizona Community Foundation**, where completing a single application may also match students with **160+ additional eligible scholarships**.

Award: Two scholarships of **\$1,500** each.

Eligibility:

- Graduating Arizona high school senior
- Planning to attend a 2- or 4-year college/university
- African American
- Minimum **3.0 GPA**
- Demonstrated financial need

Deadline: April 6

William A. Campbell Memorial Scholarship — \$1,500 (Deadline: May 30)

The **William A. Campbell Memorial Scholarship** is sponsored by **Steve Campbell** (son of the late DOTA, William A. Campbell) and **Colonel Richard Toliver (USAF, Ret.)** in honor of Campbell’s father. Colonel Campbell served as **Professor of Air Science at Tuskegee Institute (1955–1958)**.

Award: Up to four scholarships of **\$1,500** awarded annually

Eligibility:

- High school senior with minimum overall **3.0 GPA**
- Planning to attend a college/university and major in any **STEM discipline**

- Submit a **500-word essay** on how the **Tuskegee Airmen legacy** served as motivation
Deadline: May 30
